CITY COUNCIL

On June 13, 2002, the City Council voted unanimously to send the Wilson Street Pump Station project out to bid. This project will replace the existing Wilson Street pump station. The aging of the existing pumps and the need for an increase in capacity has led to the replacement of the pump station. The Council also decided to enter into negotiations with the law firm of Jordan/Schrader for the services of City Attorney. Negotiations should be completed by the June 27, 2002 Council meeting.

The City Council is the policy making body of the City. The Council meets on the 2nd and 4th Thursday's of every month at 6:30 p.m. Three of the Council positions will be for 2 years and three of the positions will be for 4 years. In order to qualify, you must be a registered voter, and you must have resided inside the City limits for at least 12 months prior to the election. The deadline to file for a Mayor or Council position is 5:00 p.m., August 27, 2002. Please come by City Hall to pick up an application.
