CITY COUNCIL

At the May 9, 2002, the City Council voted unanimously to send the pre-design report for the proposed wastewater treatment plant to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the Oregon Economic and Community Development Department for comment and review. Once comments are received from these agencies, the report will go back to the Council for final approval.
