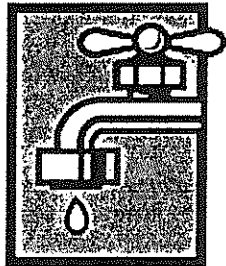


Welcome to the monthly newsletter that is distributed to the citizens of Lafayette to keep the citizens as informed as possible of the events of the City.

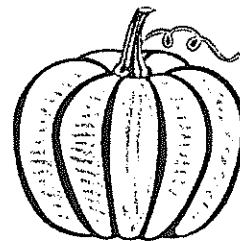
SEWER PLANT UPDATE

The engineering of the City's new Wastewater Treatment Plant is progressing. Draft engineering plans were submitted to DEQ (Department of Environmental Quality), and were approved on September 11, 2003. The final plans must be submitted to DEQ by March 11, 2004. The City is currently negotiating a contract with Adolfson and Associates to complete the required environmental review of the property. Our goal is to begin construction of the new facility in June 2004.
